

Images of the "Roaring Twenties:" a Centennial Celebration

This program focuses on one of the most exciting time periods in American history -- the 1920s. This decade is best remembered for scandalous fashions, revolutionary jazz music and amazing new freedoms for women.

This slide lecture concentrates on the newly "liberated" women of the 1920s -- known as flappers -- whose rebellious attitude inspired risqué, flashy fashions, unorthodox behavior and a demand for equality.
