

Toulouse-Lautrec: Decadence & Spectacle in Fin-de-siècle Paris

The paintings of Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec are almost synonymous with the Montmartre district of Paris at the end of the nineteenth century. In terms of style and content, his work reflected the modernity, spectacle and decadence of this social milieu.

Art historian Jeff Mishur presents this program. In this slide lecture, Mishur discusses major works by Toulouse-Lautrec and provides an art historical context for each. He will also relate these works to those painted by other important artists working in Paris during the same period.

Mishur is co-owner of Art Excursions, Inc., a company that provides art related lectures and tours in the United States and private guiding in Chicago. Jeff Mishur has taught art history at the university level for more than twenty years.
