

**Petra: The Rose Red City** 

Petra flourished as the capital of the Nabateans between the 4th century b.c. until Roman occupation in 106 AD. Located at the crossroads of international commerce in the center of the caravan trade, this once-thriving city is remarkable for its rose red colored architectural forms carved out of the stratified rock. From this location, the Nabateans prospered from the sale of water that they harnessed and controlled.
