



POMPEII: From Ashes to Archaeology

In 79 AD Mount Vesuvius erupted and covered Pompeii with volcanic ash. This event preserved streets, buildings and even humans and animals.

In this slide lecture program, Dr. Michelle Paluch-Mishur examines Roman wall paintings, ancient architecture and artifacts that offer a window into the life and appearance of the ancient city of Pompeii. She will also provide information on the discovery of Pompeii's ruins in 1592 and its impact.
